

FLOWER SHOW SCHEDULE FOR 27 JUNE 2009

**SCARECROW COMPETITION (for groups or individuals)**

The best scarecrow will win £10 and the runner-up £5. All entries should be self-supporting and fixed in the Playing Field by the side of the Hall.

**DIVISION A: VEGETABLE, FRUIT AND FLOWER**

1. An exhibition of Garden Vegetables, displayed on a flat table space up to 24" x 24", for the Richard West Trophy.
2. 3 specimens of the same vegetable.
3. Collection of 6 Culinary Herbs.
4. An exhibition of Garden Fruit, displayed on a flat table space up to 12" x 12".
5. 6 Sticks of Rhubarb.
6. Sweet Peas: one vase of 6 Stems colours by choice. The Macklow Memorial Cup.
7. Roses: 3 stems floribunda, one or more varieties.
8. Roses: 3 blooms hybrid tea, one or more varieties.
9. Roses: one specimen.
10. Roses: any one rose judged purely on fragrance.
11. Roses: 3 stems miniature/patio rose, one or more varieties.
12. Pansies: three heads. The stems should go through holes in cardboard to a water jar.
13. An exhibit of Mixed Garden flowers not less than 5 kinds, not arranged for effect.
14. An exhibit of mixed Garden Shrubs/foilage, not less than 3 types, not arranged for effect.
15. 3 stems of one variety of flower not already in Schedule.
16. A Cactus or Succulent.
17. A plant grown from seed, seedling or cutting since Autumn 2008.
18. Pot plant grown for foliage tended by exhibitor for at least 3 months.
19. Pot Plant in Flower tended by exhibitor for at least 3 months.
20. "A Pot for the Patio", planted for effect. Home grown or bought material.
21. A Hanging Basket, to be displayed on an inverted flowerpot supplied by exhibitor, home grown or bought material.

**DIVISION B: FLORAL ART**

22. Miniature Buttonhole, not to exceed 4" In length.
23. An exhibit to illustrate a Nursery Rhyme. Maximum size 24 " high (from the table) and 24" wide

24. An exhibit based on a church window. Maximum size 24" high (from the table) and 24" wide.
25. A vase of flowers, vase can be any colour or shape: size restricted to 24" high (from the table) and 24" wide.
26. A petite exhibit in fresh material not to exceed 9".

**DIVISION C: DOMESTIC**

27. Jar of Home Made Jam.
28. Jar of Home Made Marmalade.
29. Jar of Home Made Curd, any flavour.
30. Jar Home Made Jelly.
31. Jar of Pickle or Chutney.
32. 5 Sausage Rolls.
33. A decorated Lemon Sponge, any shape or size and own recipe.  
THIS IS THE ELIZABETH CUP CLASS – THE FIRST **THREE** PRIZEWINNERS ARE REQUIRED TO DONATE THEIR CAKES FOR AUCTION.
34. A Loaf Cake (recipe given). Limited to entrants who have not won a prize in the Elizabeth Cup class in the last 5 years.
35. A Bakewell Tart.
36. A yeast-risen Loaf **NOT** made in a bread maker.
37. A Yeast-risen Loaf made in a bread maker.
38. A Sewn, Knitted or Crocheted Garment.
39. An Article of Handicraft involving Sewing and/or Knitting and/or Crochet.
40. An Article of Needlework including Counted Thread and/or Tapestry and/or Needlepoint **NOT** made from a commercial kit and/or design.
41. An article of Needlework including Counted Thread and/or Tapestry and/or Needlepoint made from a commercial kit and/or design.
42. A Patchwork/Quilted article.
43. A Monochrome Drawing (any medium).
44. A Painting (any medium).
45. An Artificial Flower made from any material – up to 3 stems.
46. An article of Handicraft, not in Classes 38 to 42 made from a commercial kit or design.
47. An article of Handicraft, not in Classes 38 to 42 **NOT** made from a commercial kit or design.
48. A Handmade Greetings card made from a kit or digital picture.
49. A handmade Greetings card **NOT** made from a commercial kit or design.

## FLOWER SHOW SCHEDULE (CONT)

50. An example of Calligraphy, between 4 and 10 lines on A4 maximum size paper.
51. Objets Trouvés displayed on a card not larger than 12" x 12" (Not to have been previously shown).

### **Objets Trouvés**

These are objects "found" anywhere such as rocks, stones and pebbles in various shaped, colours and sizes: driftwood (remember the size limit) or plant material such as odd shaped carrots also the many varieties of shells, off-cuts of wood which have not been worked on in any way and so on.

### **DIVISION C: DOMESTIC (continued)**

**All photographs to have been taken in 2008/2009 and to be mounted on thin card**

1. "From an Odd Perspective", black and white or coloured; maximum dimension 12" (or 30.5 cm).
2. "Steps", black and white or coloured; maximum dimension 12" (or 30.5 cm).
3. An Abingdon Photograph, black and white or coloured; maximum dimension 12" (or 30.5 cm).

**Sizes given in Classes 52, 53 and 54 are of photographs, excluding the mount.**

4. A collection of local photographs, black and white or coloured, mounted on A3 size card.
5. "Insects", a collection of digitally enhanced photographs, mounted on A4 card.

### **DIVISION D: YOUTHS (18 years and younger)**

6. A Loaf Cake (recipe given).
7. A plant grown from seed, seedling or cutting since Autumn 2008.
8. A Painting or Drawing (any medium).
9. A computer generated design for the front of this Schedule – "Radley Flower Show 2010. Schedule and Entry Form".
10. A Greetings Card.
11. An article of Handicraft in hard or soft material.
12. A photograph, "Steps", black and white or coloured, mounted on thin card.

### **DIVISION E: CHILDREN (under Secondary School age)**

13. A Recycled Boat.
14. A Bendy Straw Flower.
15. A Fruit and Vegetable Creature.

16. Flowers in a jam jar.
17. Cress **OR** Grass grown in a decorated Polystyrene Cup.

**Note: A child may enter classes 1 – 68 and a "Youth" may enter classes 1 – 63**
